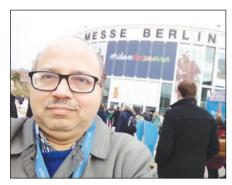

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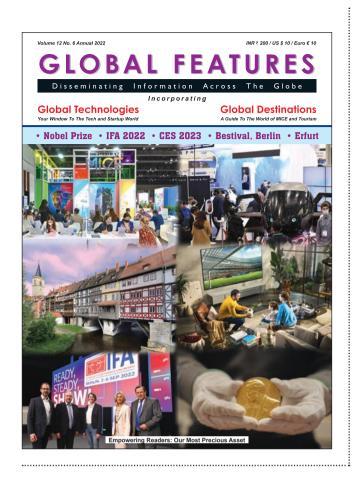

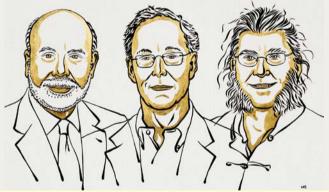

Record number of laureates on hand in Stockholm for this year's Nobel Week

December 6 – 12 will mark the 2022 Nobel Week. The Nobel Foundation has invited this year's Nobel Prize laureates together with laureates from 2020 and 2021. No fewer than 27 laureates will attend this year's festivities in Stockholm. A number of other previous laureates will also participate in the Nobel Week Dialogue science conference on 9 December.

"After two years of cancelled festivities, we are finally able to welcome the Nobel Prize laureates to Stockholm. This will give



us a fantastic opportunity to celebrate science, literature and peace efforts during an entire week. Given the challenges the world faces, it feels especially important to highlight Alfred Nobel's idea of international community, respect for knowledge and a belief in humankind's ability to bring about changes," says Vidar Helgesen, Executive Director of the Nobel Foundation.

It will be a busy period for the laureates who visit Stockholm during the Nobel Week. The prize-awarding institutions will organise press conferences and Nobel lectures featuring the 2022 laureates. In keeping with tradition, all 27 laureates will be invited to the Nobel Prize Museum to sign a chair and hand over an artefact to the museum's collection. During the week, there will

also be time for them to visit schools and experience the Nobel Week Lights light festival, among other things. On 10 December, it will be time for this year's Nobel Prize award ceremony and banquet.

The Nobel Prize amount

Alfred Nobel left most of his estate, more than SEK 31 million (today approximately SEK 1,702 million) to be converted into a fund and invested in "safe securities." The income from the investments was to be "distributed annually in the form of prizes to those who during the preceding year have conferred the greatest benefit to mankind."

The Nobel Prize amount for 2022 is set at Swedish kronor (SEK) 10.0 million per full Nobel Prize.

Two Nobel Prize laureates declined the prize

Jean-Paul Sartre, awarded the 1964 Nobel Prize in Literature, declined the prize because he had consistently declined all official honours

Le Duc Tho, awarded the 1973 Nobel Peace Prize jointly with

US Secretary of State Henry Kissinger. They awarded were the prize for negotiating the Vietnam peace accord. Le Duc Tho said that he was not in a position to accept the Nobel Peace Prize, citing the situation in Vietnam as his reason.

Forced to decline the Nobel Prize

Four Nobel Prize laureates have been forced by authorities to decline the Nobel Prize. Adolf Hitler forbade three German Nobel Prize laureates, Richard Kuhn, Adolf Butenandt and Gerhard Domagk, from accepting the Nobel Prize. All of them could later receive the Nobel Prize diploma and medal, but not the prize amount.

Boris Pasternak, the 1958 Nobel Laureate in Literature, initially accepted the Nobel Prize but was later coerced by the authorities of the Soviet Union, his native country, to decline the Nobel Prize.

Multiple Nobel Prize laureates

The work of the International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC) has been honoured by a Nobel Peace Prize three times. Besides, the founder of the ICRC, Henry Dunant, was awarded the first Nobel Peace Prize in 1901.

Linus Pauling is the only person to have been awarded two unshared Nobel Prizes – the 1954 Nobel Prize in Chemistry and the 1962 Nobel Peace Prize.

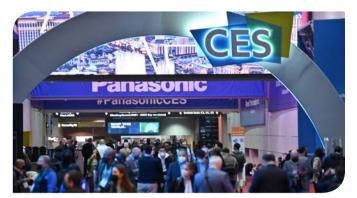
Nobel Foundation

The IFA+ Summit brought together leading experts from business, politics and science to discuss the future of globalisation – and de-globalisation. While most agreed that without global trade our world would suffer a significant drop in both wealth and quality of life, the discussions also showed that global trade flows have to be made much more sustainable, so that our world can contain climate change.

SHIFT Mobility - The mobility event without limits

The two-day innovation conference SHIFT Mobility 2022 was a great success. The convention brought together automotive companies like Volkswagen, Ford, BMW and Mercedes Benz, tech giants like AWS and Qualcomm, newcomers like Lilium, Pivt, Lexgo and Autobrains, alongisdetop researchers from places like the Fraunhofer Institute and the University of Toronto, plus very young startups.

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Bestival, Berlin: Truly an innovative format





Bestival, Berlin is a stimulating event taking the participants through a variety of experiences spread across the city feels our editor *Chandragupta Amritkar* who was impressed by some of the unique concepts of Bestival.

Post Covid I planned to visit one of my favourite countries, Germany (my 56th visit to Germany) this time to cover a totally new event - Bestival in Berlin. In its 2nd edition visitBerlin team spared no efforts in bringing 800 trade and meeting professionals from across the globe (happy to inform Global Features was the only Indian media present) to Berlin. Spread over two days tourism and convention professionals were enlightened by expert lectures, workshops, events and thematic tours. Co-ordinating with Joyce Olivia Bernitt, Market Management/ Project Manager, Press and Fam Trips, visitBerlin I planned the visit

The festival kicked off with a welcome party at the 100 + year old Clärchens Balhaus (a ballroom) providing a chance to interact with ones fraternity as well as the organisers. For me it was such a pleasure meeting Joyce face to face after all the e-correspondence and also catching up with my dear friend Robert Luft, Senior Business Development Manager Conventions. It also provided an opportunity to interact with the visitBerlin top management - Burkhard Kieker, CEO, Ralf Ostendorf, Director Market Management (including India) and Marco Oelschlegel, Director Conventions.

The next day the inauguration of Bestival was done at Kino International (a film theatre located in East Berlin and now a prominent venue for Berlinale, the annual Berlin Film Festival) by Burkhard Kieker, CEO visitBerlin.

In a pleasing tone he said "More than 800 national and international industry experts from the visitor economy and the convention industry are coming together in Berlin today for the Bestival. In a unique mix of lectures, workshops and live experiences, we will introduce them to our city and discuss current trends. Thanks to the excellent teamwork with many Berlin partners, we were able to realize this event."

Stephan Schwarz, Senator for Economics, Energy, and Public Enterprises, welcomed the participants via a video message "I am pleased that event and tourism experts from all over Europe are coming together in Berlin for this innovative event format. Berliners and the city's guests, love the capital for its creativity, its innovations and its diversity. It is great that all of this can be experienced on site and in person again this year."

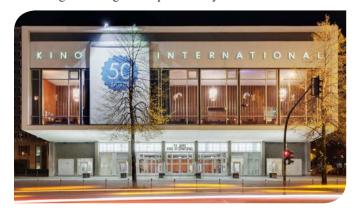
Post Burkhard Kieker speech the audience was enthralled by

Jocelyn B. Smith performance and her keynote Matla Ahuna – The Power is Within Me as well as her compositions. She touched the audience with her motivational and inspirational story. A "Science Slam" was also held with audience voting the best science project presented.

In the afternoon we all shifted to Café Moskau, right across the road for a diverse programme of informal presentations, workshops, tastings, fashion shows etc. The space was divided into 5 thematic areas: "Urban Jungle" - with sustainability-themed offers such as urban gardens and vegan restaurants; "Glamor and Lifestyle" - dedicated to fashion and fine dining; "Wild Berlin" - which presents avant-garde culture and the scene of partying in clubs; "Art and Music" - street art, galleries, museums and concerts; "Berlin Innovative" - to talk about science and start-ups.

Apart from interaction with partners of Bestival – DMC, hotels, venues, restaurants, catering services agencies, there were numerous talks and panel discussions enlightening participants with their experiences, ideas and vision. Some of the eminent personalities involved included Enver Duminy, CEO of Cape Town Tourism (Cape Town and Berlin have become Sister Cities), Cornelia Wiemeyer, CEO of greenstorming GmbH, Mariette Rissenbeek, MD of the Berlin International Film Festival etc.

The pleasant surprise was meeting the charming and delightful Julia Sonnemann, PR Manager (ITB Berlin, ITB Asia, ITB China, ITB India), Messe Berlin. We sat together at the panel discussion of the CEOs of the sister cities - Enver Duminy, CEO of Cape Town Tourism and Burkhard Kieker, CEO visitBerlin creating a marketing "twinning" concept driven by mutual benefits.





The last day was focused on experiences. During the day I visited The Circus Hotel (while it was quite warm the whole week as I reached The Circus Hotel there were heavy showers which lasted the whole day), which was recently renovated. Being close to the tube station was a blessing.

The dynamic duo Juri Westermann and Anne Fillard took us all on a journey of this boutique property. The reception is located adjacent to a lounge, a library and a bar. The rooms are cosy and the rooftop terrace is nice place to relax watching a sunset. We noticed the solar panels and Juri explained "Sustainability is a top priority. We are eco-friendly with solar panels, Sustainable Cooling System etc." The hotel has a lovely little courtyard garden and they have some of the softest, crispy and large Croissants. Assured them that I will visit to experience and do a full review.

From there I proceeded to visit The Ritz-Carlton and Berlin Marriott Hotels both located just 150 meters away and right next to the historic Potsdamer Platz – the famous Berlin wall. Marina



Sol Raniolo, Multi Property Sales Manager at The Ritz-Carlton, Berlin & Berlin Marriott Hotel took us around. Both have excellent rooms and great views from the top.

I was not able to visit MOA Berlin hotel which was on my agenda (thanks to the dynamic and persuasive Marc Henning, Sales Manager) due to heavy rains. Hopefully next time.

Bestival ended with the unique concept - Long night of the hotels where we all went on a Berlin-style bar hopping with the partner hotels. Out of the several hotels you can choose several that you feel worth visiting. Feeling a bit fatigued I chose just two hotels starting with Waldorf Astoria where Jan Martensen, Director of Government Sales was the contact point. While explaining the history of the brand Martensen pointed out the lobby and said, "Called Peacock Alley it is in every Waldorf Astoria hotel as well



as the Grandfather's Clock." The hotel has 149 Deluxe Rooms and 79 suites - providing spectacular view over Berlin. The Presidential Suite spread over 280 square meters occupies the entire 31st floor. The Signature Wall in the lobby has signatures of famous visitors.

My next halt was Novotel Berlin Am Tiergarten where I met Sebastian Loelf, stellv. Direktor. The hotel has 274 rooms and 11 meeting rooms. The S bahn station is just across the road making it convenient for both leisure and business travellers.

Late night I returned to my hotel Bristol Berlin (Ex-Kempinski brand) which was one of the first high-end hotels in the 1950's. The hotel has 246 rooms and 55 suite. Though a historic place to stay, the hotel does need refurbishing of their rooms. The breakfast was superb with a lavish spread and the staff is quite friendly.

Sustainability in focus

The entire conception, organisation and realisation of "Bestival" follows a sustainability strategy based on the "Sustainable Meetings Berlin" initiative's criteria as well as ISO 20121 for sustainable event management issued by the International Organization for Standardization (ISO). For example, full CO2 compensation is provided by Atmosfair, a gold standard certified provider. All of the service providers, including their supply chains, are obliged to work ecologically and to measure and document the emissions they produce. In Café Moscow, which is the main "Bestival" venue, daylight is used and lighting is reduced to a minimum and their ventilation system is only used for ventilating and not for cooling if possible. All of the catering for "Bestival" is vegetarian or vegan. The aim is to implement "Bestival" in a long-term and climate-neutral way. The event is part of the restart programme for Berlin's event and tourism



industries and is funded by the Berlin Senate Department for Economics, Energy and Public Enterprises.



aving been to Germany several times had always used their Deutsche Bahn trains, so when I heard of Flixbus from my Indian friends I thought why not give it a try. As I was visiting four countries I decided to give it a try and worked out various combinations to provide an honest review. — Long day trip, short day trip, a night journey with connecting services (as most companies don't guarantee connections), and an airport destination.

Flixbus has the largest network in Germany with its buses usually green in colour. Most buses typically stop near central (train) stations or central bus station ZOB (Zentraler Omnibus Bahnhof).

Flixbus is one of the best buses that I've experienced. Globally some buses are smelly, not well maintained, noisy, not so comfortable seats, many a times delayed, no inbuilt rest rooms etc. In contrast I found Flixbus super clean (bathrooms on one journey was not clean while on the double-decker it was). The bus always (surprisingly) reached all the destinations and stops a few minutes before time (I strongly suspect - believe they keep a buffer time

of 15 minutes). The WiFi worked pretty well on my mobile (can't comment on laptop as I did not use).

The day journey buses were quite comfortable and I did not feel the strain and the excellent roads made the ride smooth. While I did take a nap I could relish the country side sights and greenery. An issue that I faced was communicating with the driver and his attendant — both did not understand much English. I

think this where the Flix team can put in more efforts to train them in Basic English.

The overnight bus I took was from Berlin ZOB to Munich airport (with a connection at Nuremberg) reaching at 8.15 am (my flight was at night). The bus left 10 minutes late from Berlin at 23:40 with one change at 05:15am at Nuremberg. The bus arrived at 5.10. The transfer time was one hour and the connecting bus came at exactly 06:15 and – delete. The driver was aware that I was going to board it (made me feel nice and comfortable) and then reaching – we reached Munich Airport at 08:10. On both the legs the bus wasn't full so I had my next seat empty.

Being green the buses are easy to spot in a terminal. The Flixbus prices are pocket friendly and even for 10-15 euro one can travel a substantial distance - only book a bit in advance. But do note it costs extra to reserve a seat (around 2-3 euro). One can buy tickets directly from the driver prior to boarding but the prices will be extremely steep. Cancellations are relatively easy before departure of the bus. For the tech savvy the Flixbus app is easy to use and gives latest updates.



Finally Flix offers affordable travel by train (yet to experience FlixTrain but will do so when I again travel to Berlin for ITB) and bus to over 2,500 destinations 36 countries offering 400,000 daily connections. They are also deeply committed to sustainability (as the green colour does reflect).

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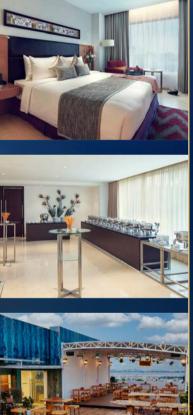
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Erfurt: Experience the medieval spirit

hen my invite for Bestival, Berlin came I thought it would be a good idea to tap a new city in Germany (this was my 56th visit to Germany and I try to visit a new town in Germany) – this time I choose Erfurt. Putting forward my request to Dr. Carmen Hildebrandt, MD, Erfurt Tourism and Marketing GmbH who in turn connected me to the charming and delightful Kristin Luther, Manager Tourism Marketing, Erfurt Tourism.



Arriving into Erfurt from Frankfurt, Kristin was kind enough to book a hotel (Intercity Hotel) adjacent to the main station. After some rest, in the afternoon met Kristin and my guide Corinna Köhlert (a very knowledgeable person).



Erfurt, the capital of the Thuringia, is an off the beaten path town where one can see and experience the true medieval spirit. It's also home to one of Europe's best-preserved medieval synagogues. As we walked through the streets the guide took us on a trip full of history. First we crossed the amazing Town hall and Fischmarkt Square before going to the 14th-century Krämerbrücke, or Merchant's Bridge—a medieval stone arch bridge (initially in wood but rebuilt in stone in 1325) - the lengthiest continuously inhabited bridge in Europe. Beautifully restored, with cobblestone lanes and half-timbered two- and three-story homes with cafes,

galleries, and boutiques offering traditional crafts, Thuringian blue printed fabrics, hand-painted ceramics etc. giving a vibrant village-like feel. Around the turn you will be surprised to see water flowing under the streets that you just walked.

Our next halt was the St. Mary's Cathedral and St Severus' Church, located on a hillside overlooking the main town square (Domplatz, Cathedral Square) giving a scenic view. Mainly built



in the International Gothic style the central tower houses the "Gloriosa", the world's largest medieval free-swinging bell with a diameter of 2.56-metres. As a unique architectural ensemble, both churches together form the city's landmark.

We then proceeded to the Old Synagogue, one of the best preserved medieval synagogues in Europe. Constructed during the Middle Ages on the "via regia", one of the major European trade routes, it's very close to the Merchants Bridge and the town hall. After extensive restoration, the building was reopened in 2009 as a museum where medieval artifacts (discovered during archaeological excavations) from Erfurt's Jewish community were made accessible to the public. This includes 3,140 silver coins, 14 silver ingots, approx. 6,000 works of gold smithery from the 13th and 14th centuries and an intricately worked wedding ring of the period, of which only two others are known to exist anywhere in the world.

A nice hike brings you to the Petersberg Citadel that towers over Erfurt like a crown and provides tourist with a bird's eye view. The fortress surrounded by 2,180 metres of stone walls dates back a 1,000 years and has a star-shaped layout that was almost



impregnable for enemies. There are tunnels within the walls called 'listening passages' so that soldiers could walk through them to listen for anyone trying to tunnel into the fortress or if attackers tried to dig a tunnel into the mountain and to sound the alarm. A guided tour through the historic listening passages (generally an hour) would be of interest to tourists.



The Citadel was originally built on the site of a medieval Benedictine Monastery and this baroque fortress was in military use until 1963. Post German reunification (in 1990), the citadel has undergone significant restoration. The Visitor Center, which I noticed immediately due to its modern glass facade is in great contrast to the historic buildings. It provides you the history of the fortress.

A former church and monastery complex dating from the 13th century, St. Augustine's Monastery is almost one hectare (2.5 acres) in size. It is most well known as the former home of Martin Luther (1483–1546), the father of the Reformation, who lived there as a friar from 1505 until 1511. The Lutherzelle (Luther's cell) can be visited as part

of the exhibition. Since 1988 the monastery has been used as an ecumenical conference centre and a memorial to Luther. St. Augustine's Monastery, along with 11 other sites, added to the UNESCO World Heritage Site designated "Luther Sites in Central Germany".

Later in the night we proceeded to have dinner in an Indian restaurant 'Masala'. Apart from Masala restaurant Erfurt has two more Indian restaurants - Restaurant Bombay and Punjabi Virsa.

The next day I proceeded by the local tram to Légère hotel which is located right next to the Messe Erfurt Exhibition Center and the Congress Centrum. This conference hotel is optimal for presentations and customer meetings. Due to the functional design the hotel can be used as an event location.

Radisson Blu Hotel

From Légère hotel I proceeded to Radisson Blu Hotel, easily noticeable as it majestically stands 60 meters tall. Impressed by the façade, I was greeted by Ulrike Zelinski, corporate & leisure group coordinator and Michael Rosin, GM of the property. Ulrike took me around the wonderful property with 284 rooms and suites. The hotel also has two on-site restaurants and two bars.





Then we proceeded to see the MICE facilities – with a choice from 11 conference rooms that can host from ten to 400 guests making it an ideal venue for a corporate or social event. Located on the 1st and 17th floors, meetings on the top floor can be accompanied by stunning city views.

"One of our biggest advantage is the location right in the center of the old town, surrounded by medieval architecture and historic churches, just a kilometre from Erfurt Central Station making it convenient for both tourists and corporate. Apart from this our stunning views from the top which I would like to show you," said Michael Rosin.

As I was short of time (I had to proceed to taking my train to Berlin), with a heavy heart I had to decline. But the GM was kind enough to invite me to experience his property on my next visit. Which I humbly accepted and awaiting to visit this city again.

Located in the heart of one of the city's main commercial districts it is easily accessible by the nearby Sky Train and MRT train networks. The hotel looks amazing with its delightful interiors that were designed by Singaporean designer Kathryn Kng.

Our accommodation is spacious and we have always been at the forefront when it comes to cuisine and wellness, two incredibly important elements in Thai culture. The hotel has 169 guest rooms and suites ranging from 280 -2,583sq ft area. I liked the Penthouse Suites - a two-floor duplex. The Como Shambala bathroom products is another attraction for the guests. On the F&B front the hotel has a Michelin-starred restaurant nahm where I savoured a vegetarian lunch with Rohaan.

"With Cuisine being one of our brand pillars, it is a key element of the COMO experience globally. Here we have been awarded a Michelin star for the fifth consecutive year in the Michelin



Guide Thailand 2022. nahm features Thai cuisine, with dishes incorporating rare ingredients from all regions of Thailand. Thai cuisine is full of joy and flavour," said Rohaan. COMO Shambhala Cuisine uses ingredients that are rich in nutritional values with the goal to boost vitality.

On the MICE front the Metropolitan Event spaces can accommodate up to 80 people. In addition to this the Penthouse Suite is available for events, accommodating cocktail parties up to 20 people. Add to this the COMO Shambhala Urban Escape with state of-the-art facilities, therapists and Asian-inspired treatments. The hotel has a 25m outdoor lap pool. The hotel also provides daily complimentary yoga classes.



But I thoroughly took pleasure in the COMO Shambhala massage which certainly is worth a try as it has been specially curated (It was one of the best massages I had in Thailand). The signature massage uses long massage technique strokes from the feet to the shoulders working on one side of the body and then the other.

"It was developed with our Owner and Founder and various notable physical therapists and body specialists to ensure that the end result was a body therapy that would assist to rebalance the senses, ease out muscular tension and a feeling of deep relaxation. Essential for those that travel long distances for work or for pleasure," said Rohaan.

The group strives to deliver experiences that are unique to you and the country you are visiting, from our city hotels in London, Perth and Bangkok, to island retreats in the Maldives, Fiji, Turks and Caicos and Thailand, from wild lodges in Bhutan's Himalayan valleys to resorts in Bali and Italy.





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
